While it is easier to just bag up things you no longer need, don't be wasteful and throw away usable items. In and around Obihiro there are second-hand shops which are commonly called リサイクルショップ *recycle shop*. You can sell things from old clothes to unused wet tissue packs! Give your items new life and maybe make some extra money from it.



Reuse!

Other items that are not reused are recycled to make rags for cleaning. These rags are available for purchase.

Please note that winter clothes are not accepted as most of their items are sent abroad to countries that do not experience winter.

“Reduce” the Right Way!

Ideally, your unwanted items should have been greatly reduced through the last two options. You might still have a mountain of things that just can’t be given away or sold. Of course, putting them into their designated bags and dragging them out to the trash station is a common thing to do,

but your mountain might just be too much!

In that case, head to the Kuririn Center!

While you have to haul your own trash, going to the Kuririn Center lets you skip the bagging (you don’t need to buy the designated bags, but you still need to bag loose items!) and even throw away large items, such as furniture. There is a fee of 170 yen per 10 kg of trash. While you don’t have to wait to throw out your trash, there are some things are not accepted. Specialty items such as car batteries/tires, gas tanks, computers, refrigerators, etc. can not be disposed of at the Kuririn Center. ※Closed on Sundays and certain holidays.

For Specialty Items

Ask your local town hall about specific rules. Larger items such as tires can often be taken care of by the shop that sold it to you. Most people have their old tires disposed off at the same time as their new tire purchase. There may be a small fee to dispose of specialty items, due to the extra work necessary.

Don’t just throw everything out to the curb, put some effort into keeping our Earth clean and happy this spring!
