

Disaster Prevention in Japan: Typhoon 防災コラム(台風)

This article is a continuation of the disaster awareness series featured in the Obihiro Pioneer. Materials featured in this article are adapted from the Obihiro City's disaster prevention and preparation website. In this issue of Obihiro Pioneer, we will introduce prevention tactics more specifically for typhoons, as they become more frequent from July until October. Many of the topics in this issues can also be used during other disasters.

What is a Typhoon? (台風 taifuu)

A typhoon is a tropical cyclone which occurs due to temperature and pressure changes. The term "typhoon" is used in the northwest Pacific area, while "hurricane" is used to describe the same phenomenon in northeast Pacific and northern Atlantic areas. Japan calls these strong tropical cyclones 台風 taifuu.

Prepare for Water and Wind

A typhoon is essentially strong winds

強風 *kyoufuu* and heavy rain 大雨

occurring happening at the same time.

Unlike an earthquake, typhoons can be predicted ahead of time, allowing one to get themselves prepared before the storm fully hits. Here are some of the likely disasters that may occur due to a typhoon:

Flooding 洪水 *kouzui*

Those living near rivers should be especially alert when there are heavy rains.



Be prepared to move earlier than friends who live in other parts of town. You should avoid going outside if there is a flash flood warning, but if you are driving and are no longer able to proceed due to flooding, try to move yourself and the vehicle to a safe area, turn off the engine and wait for the storm to finish or for help to come.

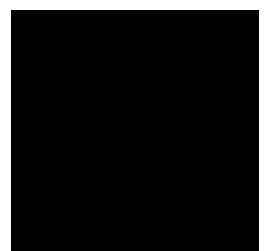

Strong Winds 強風 *kyoufuu*

Do your best to secure objects outside that may become displaced due to the strong wind. As mentioned in the “Earthquake” edition of this series, applying shatter-proof film to your windows will help keep glass from flying if it breaks suddenly. Taping a large “X” over your windows is also an alternative that helps to lessen the shattering. Again, do not go outside unless absolutely necessary. Strong winds will cause objects to go flying and take down trees and powerlines.

Power Outage 停電 *teiden*

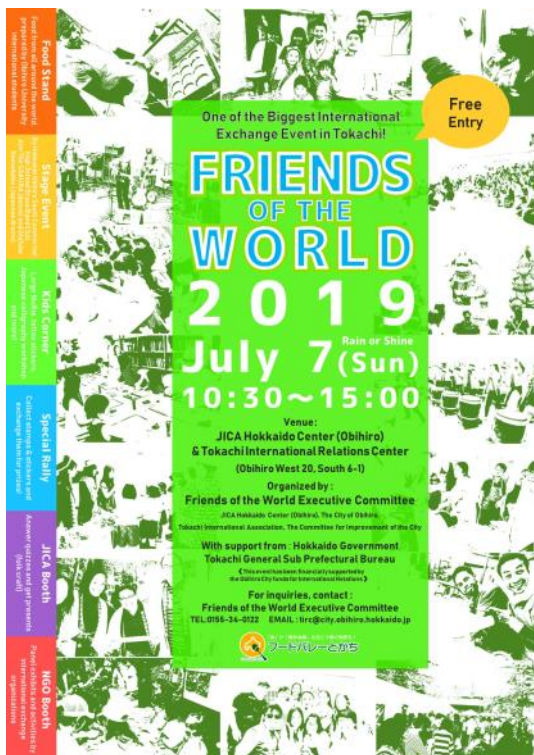
A power outage could occur for a number of reasons and is not usual during a typhoon. Because a power outage is sudden, you can only wait until the power comes back.

During that time, you should try to reserve your resources as long as possible. Avoid opening your refrigerator and freezer to keep its contents cold. Secure water, just in case the power is out for a long period of time. In some cases your home’s water may not be running. If you are living on the 2nd floor or higher, this may be due to the building’s water pump not having electricity to move. While the power is out, be sure to switch off your circuit breaker and unplug your items. When the power does come back, it may affect any electronics or appliances plugged in and cause a fire. Look for your home’s breaker and learn how to turn it on and off before a real power outage comes.
