**Obihiro Pioneer:** Jun, thank you for allowing us to interview you during such a busy time. 2 years have already passed since you came to Obihiro. Can you tell us some of your first impressions and/or assumptions of Obihiro/Hokkaido and if they have changed over the last couple of years?

**Jun:** Well, some of my first impressions of Obihiro/Hokkaido have changed since I first started living here. I have to clarify first though, that my first impressions of Obihiro/Hokkaido were mostly based on my personal circumstances.

I work at Tokachi International Relations Center (TIRC), which is a separate facility from the Obihiro City Hall. At TIRC, we organize many events and I have had the opportunity to

interact with the local Japanese people. Through these events, I found that people from Obihiro/Hokkaido to be welcoming and friendly. 2 years on, I still feel the same way.

In addition, coming from a metropolitan city, I used to think that there was not much to explore or see in Obihiro/Hokkaido besides the tourist attractions, which was not my cup of tea anyway. I have always liked exploring new, non-touristy places but public transportation was prohibitive in terms of cost, schedule and places I could get to. Honestly speaking, I went to a few places when I first got here, but gave up exploring more until I purchased a car recently.

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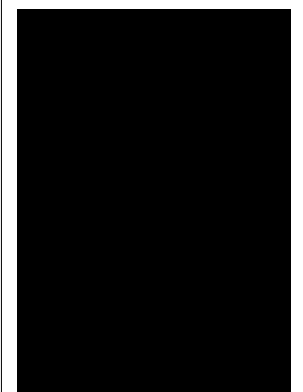

**OP:** We heard that you will be remaining in Japan after leaving Obihiro. Hopefully somewhere a little warmer!

*Can you tell us where you will be going and what you will be doing there?*

**J:** I will be moving to Tokyo to work as a software engineer, and I definitely am looking forward to less (no?) snow.

**OP:** We wish you the best of luck in Tokyo! The big city has so much to offer, but it doesn't have everything. Is there anything you'll miss from Obihiro/Hokkaido while in Tokyo?

**J:** Definitely! I will miss all the friends I made here, delicious Hokkaido food and my spot in Starbucks. (You read that right!)

**OP:** Last, but not least, any words of advice for the new CIR coming to fill your shoes?

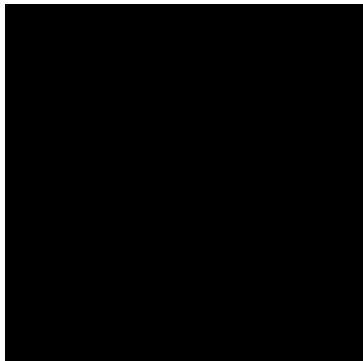
**J:** Definitely! First, it will be really helpful to know what everyone is in charge of so you know where to go to for advice regarding work. Second, manage your expectations. You might be ambitious and want to suggest multiple new events. It takes time to communicate and get these events (and budget) approved. I absolutely recommend avoiding summer, the peak period at work, when trying to get approval for these events. Lastly, always remember that you are on the Japan Exchange and Teaching program. I believe that at the core of this program is the idea of bilateral cultural exchange, where you learn more about Japan and teach others about your own culture. It is a fantastic opportunity for you to interact with people from all walks of life, so make the best of it!
