In this month's issue of Obihiro Pioneer, we are happy to welcome the newest member of the Obihiro CIR (coordinator for international relations) family, Gavin Munnelly ギャビン・マネリ! Gavin hails from the little country of Ireland in Europe. We had the opportunity to interview him as he begins to settle down here in Obihiro:

Obihiro Pioneer: Thank you Gavin for allowing us to interview you. It must be a busy time for you, especially after moving all the way here from Ireland. How has these first couple of weeks been for you so far?

Gavin: Thank you for having me! These first few weeks certainly have been quite busy, but it's been an amazing experience so far. Although I've only been here a month I've already gone ice skating (in summer!!), seen fireworks and participated in the Bon festival dance. Jun, the CIR before me, had forewarned me that I was arriving right in the middle of the TIRC's busiest period but I really had no idea exactly how busy it can get. However, I'm really enjoying how varied the work is and how I can interact with the citizens of Obihiro on an everyday basis. I was a little unsure of what to expect before coming to Obihiro, but everyone has been so kind I feel right at home (even despite how poor my Japanese is!).

G: Of course! I come from the town of Midleton in County Cork, which is in the south of Ireland. It's a medium-sized town (by Irish standards) about 20 minutes away from Cork City, surrounded by rolling green hills and is close to the sea. It doesn't have much claim to fame, but it does have a large distillery for Jameson Whiskey! Perhaps you've heard of Jameson? It's a very popular whiskey back home!

I love discovering new places and things, learning new things about other countries' cultures, and experimenting with cooking by combining ingredients from different countries' cuisines (it doesn't work out well very often though!). I also enjoy games of all types, video, board and card games. Above all I really love stories and animation! I'll happily watch any animated film or read any book or comic regardless of target audience.

OP: We understand that it isn't your first time to Japan, but it is your first time living in Hokkaido. What

challenges do you expect to face while here in the wild north? Also, is there anything in particular that you're looking forward to?

G: The first thing that comes to mind is the Hokkaido winter. Ireland doesn't tend to get much snow, and whenever it does snow heavily, the entire country tends to shut down! I think learning how to deal with -20°C weather will be my first major challenge, but honestly I'm looking forward to it because I think I might enjoy the challenge. Maybe it's a little naïve of me, but I'm more worried about learning the office paperwork system at the moment!

As for anything that I'm looking forward to, I can't wait to go snowboarding in the winter. I've only gone snowboarding once before but I'm just itching to try it again. Then next summer I'd be really excited if I could do a few motorcycle trips around Hokkaido and a bit of camping. In short, I want to experience a bit of that wildness of the wild north! But above all I'm looking forward to being able to introduce a little bit of Irish culture to everyone and learn about Japanese and other countries' cultures in return.

OP: How adventurous! We bet our readers are just dying to meet you! Where and when can they meet you?

G: Well actually, I will be the guest speaker for this month's International Talk at the TIRC. I'll be introducing some Irish culture, so if you'd like to know a bit about the Emerald Isle, or even if you would just like to say hi please come by! The event will start at 18:30 on the 21st. It might be a little bit cold, so please come prepared with warm clothes!


We at Obihiro Pioneer wish Gavin all the best as he continues his new journey here in Obihiro, Hokkaido.
