# **Tokachi's Winter Weather**

Can you feel the chill in the air? Winter is coming soon to Tokachi, and with it the famous Tokachi cold. But why exactly is Tokachi so cold? In this month's issue of Obihiro Pioneer, we examine why.

The reason why Tokachi is so cold in winter starts in Siberia. In winter time, northwesterly winds bring cold air and snowfall from Siberia to Hokkaido. However, Tokachi is surrounded by a mountain range, which the heavier air containing snow struggles to climb over. This results in a large snowfall on the north-easterly side of the mountain range, and the now lighter cold dry air flowing into Tokachi, bringing with it clear sunny weather. This sunny weather in turn further decreases the temperature, as the clear skies allow heat naturally produced by the earth to escape into the atmosphere more easily.

These factors result in a lower snowfall compared to the rest of Hokkaido and a very low average temperature in the Tokachi region. However, the combination of these low temperatures and sunny weather can result in some spectacular weather phenomena, such as:

# 十勝の冬の天気

### Unryu

On sunny days when the temperature drops below -15°C, keep an eye out for Unryu on the banks of the Tokachi river! This slow-moving undulating cloud of mist forms just over the river's surface and follows all the way along its length like a winding dragon made of mist.

#### Sun Pillars

On cold days, look to the horizon during sunset and you may spot pillars of light stretching up into the sky! These pillars are formed when particles of ice in the atmosphere reflect light back to the observer, giving the impression that light sources stretch far up into the sky, forming pillars of light.

#### **Diamond Dust**

This phenomenon is somewhat rare in certain areas of Tokachi, but on sunny days when it's very cold, the ambient moisture in the atmosphere at ground level can freeze, causing the air itself to shimmer and sparkle around you like magic.

Keep an eye out for these special phenomena when the temperatures start to drop!

# Japan's Flu Season 日本の季節性インフルエンザ

Winter in Japan heralds the arrival of the yearly flu season, with peak season typically being expected from December to March. With COVID-19 still circulating, this year it's more important than ever to protect yourself as much as possible. Here are some steps we can take to ward off the flu this winter:

# Continue to follow COVID-19 preventative measures as much as possible

Avoiding the "Three Cs", frequent handwashing and use of alcohol-based hand washes, wearing face masks and practicing cough etiquette will help prevent the flu in addition to COVID-19.

# Keep a balanced diet and get enough sleep

To help fight off any infections, your body needs to be in good condition, so help take care of it by making sure you have a balanced diet and you're getting plenty of rest. While the amount of sleep needed to feel rested varies from person to person, on average getting 7-9 hours of sleep each night is recommended.

# Maintain an appropriate level of humidity

Dry air can lower the natural defenses we have against airborne diseases by drying out defensive membranes in our body. It's recommended to maintain a humidity level of 50-60% using a humidifier etc., particularly in rooms where the air loses moisture easily.

# Get the flu vaccine

You can get a yearly flu vaccine that can either protect against or help lessen the effects of the upcoming season's flu. Ask your doctor about the influenza vaccine (インフルエンザワクチン接種 infuruenza wakuchin sesshu). The cost of the vaccine will vary from clinic to clinic, but discounts are available for senior citizens (age 65 and over), high-risk individuals between the ages of 60 and 65, and middle school 3rd and high school 3rd year students. Please inquire at your local health department for more detail.
