OP: Hello Gan! Thank you for taking time out of your busy schedule to be a part of this interview. You are finally leaving TIRC after 5 and a half years! That's more than any JET Program CIR! How's that feel?

Gan: I think very few CIRs work this long, so I guess my case is a rare one haha. For me, I found that working as a CIR in Obihiro City was pretty fun, especially working at TIRC. There were so many events to organize, and there was a huge variety to my job, which I enjoyed a lot. I've improved both my English and Japanese skills together with communication and management skills. I was able to work at my own pace and also share and implement my ideas in each project. I think what made me stay this long is that my hard work was noticed by my coworkers, supervisors and the people who participated in each event. The good feedback from them made me feel rewarded and it motivated me to work harder and improve each event every time I did it. I have never wanted to "just get it done", I've always wanted to do it well. As a senpai (senior), I think this is what every

This helped form a strong relationship with the international students. Moreover, every time after the event finished, I just felt complete. I got many messages from my friends and participants telling that I am a natural dancer, telling me that they had a good time and enjoyed the event, which made me feel so happy and fulfilled because it meant that all my hard work resonated with everyone.

OP: That's so moving to hear. I'm so glad to hear that you and the people here were able to have a positive mutual impact on each other! When you first came to Obihiro, you said you wanted to learn how to ski. Did you get a chance to learn?

Gan: Did I say that??? Haha. Unfortunately, I had no chance to learn how to ski but instead, I've learned how to snowboard with my friends. My first snowboarding experience wasn't great because I didn't take any proper lessons. My friends were good at snowboarding but they just didn't know how to teach. So what they did was, they brought me to the top of the mountain and let me go down by myself. Of course, they did support me sometimes, but I took about 2 hours to get down the mountain just one time while everybody else took only about 15 minutes. To tell to the truth, I did not enjoy it at all haha. The worst thing was that on the next day I had muscle pain from head to toes. That was the worst muscle pain experience I have ever had. I didn't go again for one year after that but my friend brought me in the 3rd year, then I started to enjoy it. It feels good to look back and see how I've been improving slowly year by year. That's why I kept going every year after that. Oh, I did also go cross-country skiing as a part of my work

OP: I'd say that counts! I'm glad to hear you got to learn how to snowboard here, I hope you have a chance to come back and enjoy the Hokkaido mountains again in the future. Speaking of which, what are your plans for the future? Do you plan on staying in Japan?

Gan: After I have been thinking for a while about going back to Thailand or looking for a job in Japan, but I have decided to stay in Japan and let my next job bring me to wherever I have to be. I'm still waiting for the results of the job interview, so I still have no idea exactly where I'm going after this. However, I have decided to move out of Obihiro soon after finishing my contract with the City. If I'm not hired by the company I've currently applied to, I plan to stay in Tokyo for a couple months until I find a job, then I might move to somewhere else - wherever the new job takes place. In the worst case scenario, if I cannot find any job I want to do, my backup plan is to go back to Thailand, rest for a while and find a job there. I believe I still have a way to go, so please wish me luck!
